## City of Belton Board of Aldermen Revised Policy Guidelines Regarding Violations of City Ordinances Regulating the Sale of Liquor

## A. Administration

- 1. Policy will be administered by the City Clerk.
- 2. A copy of the adopted and or revised guidelines shall be provided to each holder of a license to sell alcoholic beverages. A copy shall be presented to the licensee when initial license is granted and upon each renewal of the license.
- 3. A copy of the adopted and or revised guidelines shall be provided to the following: Chief of Police, City Attorney, City Prosecutor, and Municipal Judge.
- 4. These guidelines and decisions made within these guidelines may be appealed to Board of Aldermen.

## B. Treatment of Violators

- 1. First violation within one year suspend sales for one day.
- 2. <u>Second violation within one year</u> suspend sales for three (3) consecutive days.
- 3. <u>Third violation within one year</u> suspend sales for fourteen (14) consecutive days.
- 4. Fourth violation within 24 months of first violation forfeit license for one year and not eligible to reapply for a liquor license for 365 days from date of revocation.
- 5. <u>Subsequent violations after a one-year revocation</u> 36-month probationary period after restoration of license. If the licensee goes 36 months without a violation, he starts over at step one of the Treatment of Violators. <u>If licensee is caught selling to minors in the 36-month probationary period</u>, it will result in another one-year revocation.

## C. <u>Definitions</u>

- 1. Sales shall refer to alcoholic beverages as defined by law.
- 2. Days shall be determined by the City Clerk and shall be consistent for all violators.
